After months of research, collaboration, drafting, and revision upon revision, our report entitled "Promoting Anti-Racism and Racial Equity in Fairfield Public Schools" is published and available to any and all interested in its contents. Its summary "At-A-Glance" document is also available online, along with the data we collected from FPS former and current students and teachers and staff.
